

Strike Crimes

California was the first state to establish a three strikes procedure. The law provides that any person that has previously been convicted of any felony which the law provides is a strike, is not eligible for probation, and on conviction of any new felony must be sent to state prison for up to twice the time a non-strike offender would receive. Persons previously convicted of two strikes face a mandatory prison term of 25 year to life. A strike offense is a felony that the law lists as a strike. Typically a strike is a serious or violent felony.
